1. INTRODUCTION

The United Country Western Dance Council® is an international organization which promotes country western dance by producing festivals and competitions across the world. We host the annual Country Dance World Championships® for partner dance and line dance competitors and we advocate country dancing as a social activity for people of all ages and abilities.

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish the selection, duties, and guidelines for being a Regional Representative of the UCWDC. This policy will also define the regions for the UCWDC throughout the World.

1.2 Reference

In accordance with Article 16.1.5 of the current UCWDC Bylaws: “The President may appoint Regional Representatives, as required, who are Sanctioned Members in good standing. Regional Representatives shall be responsible for such regional activities and other functions within their area as outlined in the Policies and Procedures Manual or assigned by the President.”

2. REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE DUTES

To be a Regional Representative of the UCWDC is a privilege and an opportunity to build the dance community in your geographic region and be part of a worldwide network of UCWDC Regional Reps. As you represent the UCWDC you are asked to serve as an ambassador of the organization and help to further the UCWDC’s communication with its Associate Members and dancers in your region.

Regional Representatives are a two-year appointed position by the President.

What does it mean to serve as a Regional Rep? Well, minimally that you will be listed on our Regional Reps list and your contact info (email and location only, not personal address and phone) will be listed on our website.

You will also be asked to perform the following duties:

1. Serve as the UCWDC contact person for your designated geographic region.
2. Represent the UCWDC in a positive manner as an ambassador and further the aims of the UCWDC as you communicate with Associate Members.
3. Be introduced (via an e-greet) to all new and renewing members in your region with personalized correspondence generated from the Associate Membership Director.
4. Disseminate information and directives from the UCWDC to your region.
5. Capture any regional Associate Member’s views for feedback to the UCWDC.
6. Attend a minimum of one (1) event in your region other than your own event, with these understandings:
 - a. You will be provided a complimentary event pass by the Regional Event
 - b. You will be provided no other concessions by the event or the UCWDC
 - c. You will be announced at the region’s events as the UCWDC Regional Representative (able and available to assist Associate Members)
7. Be named as an eligible Official Observer for the UCWDC and attend events outside your region, as requested or assigned by the General Council. Official UCWDC Official Observer duties are outlined in the UCWDC Bylaws and Policies & Procedures manual.



8. Provide or coordinate photos and recap summary article(s) for the UCWDC Newsletter-for the events in your region.
9. Attend Regional Rep Meetings if in attendance at UCWDC General Meetings. Electronic attendance may also be requested.
10. Provide a Regional Rep report (oral and written) at each General Council meeting outlining:
 - a. both positive and negative issues in brief that impact on the UCWDC in your region,
 - b. growth and expansion of the UCWDC in your region,
 - c. common regional issues or observed trends.
11. Contact and maintain a relationship with dance studios in your region and explain the benefits of participation with the UCWDC.
12. Promote and refer any parties interested in applying for a UCWDC Sanctioned Event to the President or Secretary.
13. Direct any questions or correspondence relating to the organization to the appropriate Committee Chair.

3. NOMINATION AND APPOINTMENT OF REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

The following guidelines are intended to be used for the nomination and appointment of UCWDC Event Directors to the position of Regional Representative

1. Eligible Regional Representatives must come from all active Event Directors with the exception of officers on the Executive Committee and must be:
 - a. an Event Director in good standing holding not less than 16% of their respected dance event , AND
 - b. an Event Director willing to perform their duties as outlined in Section 2.0 of this policy.
2. Nominee Process
 - a. The Regional Representative nominee(s) are selected by the Members in their region.
 - b. Regions will put forward one (1) Representative nominee from their region for review and appointment by the President.
 - c. All Members in their respected region will be notified by the Secretary at the time of the General Meeting announcement that the appointment of their Regional Representative will take place at the forthcoming General Meeting.
 - d. Selection of a region's nominee shall be performed thusly:
 1. All Members of the Region will meet and discuss the duties of a Regional Rep, the qualities desired by the UCWDC, and select one (1) nominee to have his/her name stand for appointment.
 2. If Members are unable to attend the General Meeting, a Member representative in attendance from their region will contact all remaining Members to allow for their input and vote(s) for a nominee.
3. The Regional Representative must have a good reputation, a clear understanding of the English language, and must be able to speak and write fluently in English. The Regional Representative should speak as many languages from the region as possible. The Regional Representative is also encouraged to discover for his/her use as many trusted translators as needed for every language spoken within the region.



4. The Regional Representative will hold an important and necessary position on the UCWDC Board of Directors. Because the Board of Directors (consisting of the Regional Representatives and the Executive Committee of UCWDC elected Officers) frequently does UCWDC business of a more immediate nature between General Meetings which requires impending discussion and deliberation. It is essential that every UCWDC Region be represented in these meetings and discussions, therefore every Regional Rep must either attend or if the Rep cannot attend, it becomes his/her responsibility to inquire of the subject matter and the nature of the discussions, so that he/she can stay current on whatever issue is in play and may vote in absentia on the proceedings or proposals.
5. In the event of death, resignation, incapacity, or any other inability of a Regional Representative to perform his/her functions, the UCWDC Board of Directors shall declare that he/she has ceased to hold the position of Regional Representative and set the effective date of dismissal. The Board of Directors shall then appoint a replacement. The General Council then must ratify the replacing person in his/her position for the remainder of the two (2) year term.

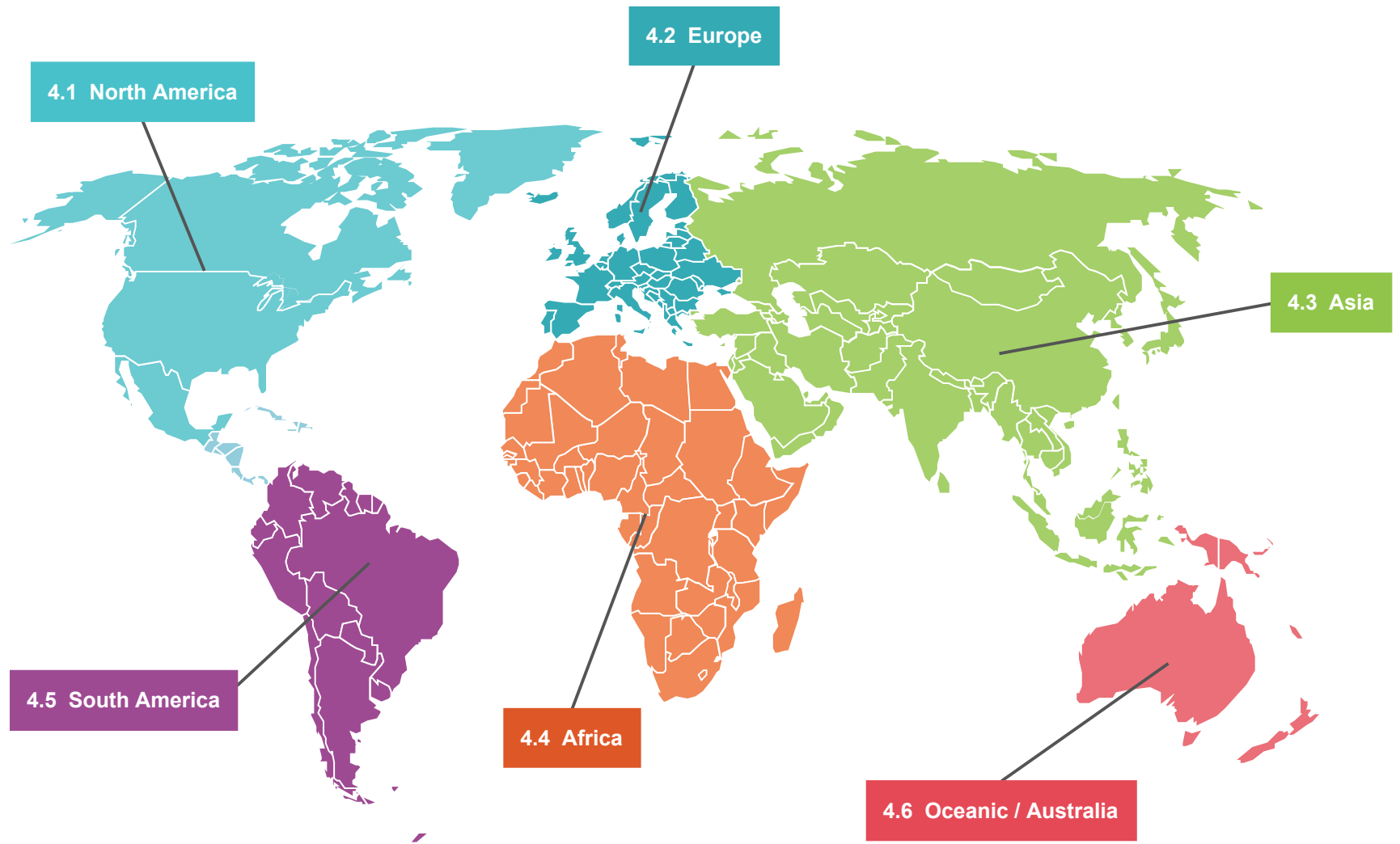

- d. United States - Southeast
- e. United States - South Central
- f. United States - North Central (Midwest)
- g. United States - Pacific / Rocky Mountain
- h. Europe - Northern
- i. Europe - Southern
- j. Europe - Western
- k. Asia

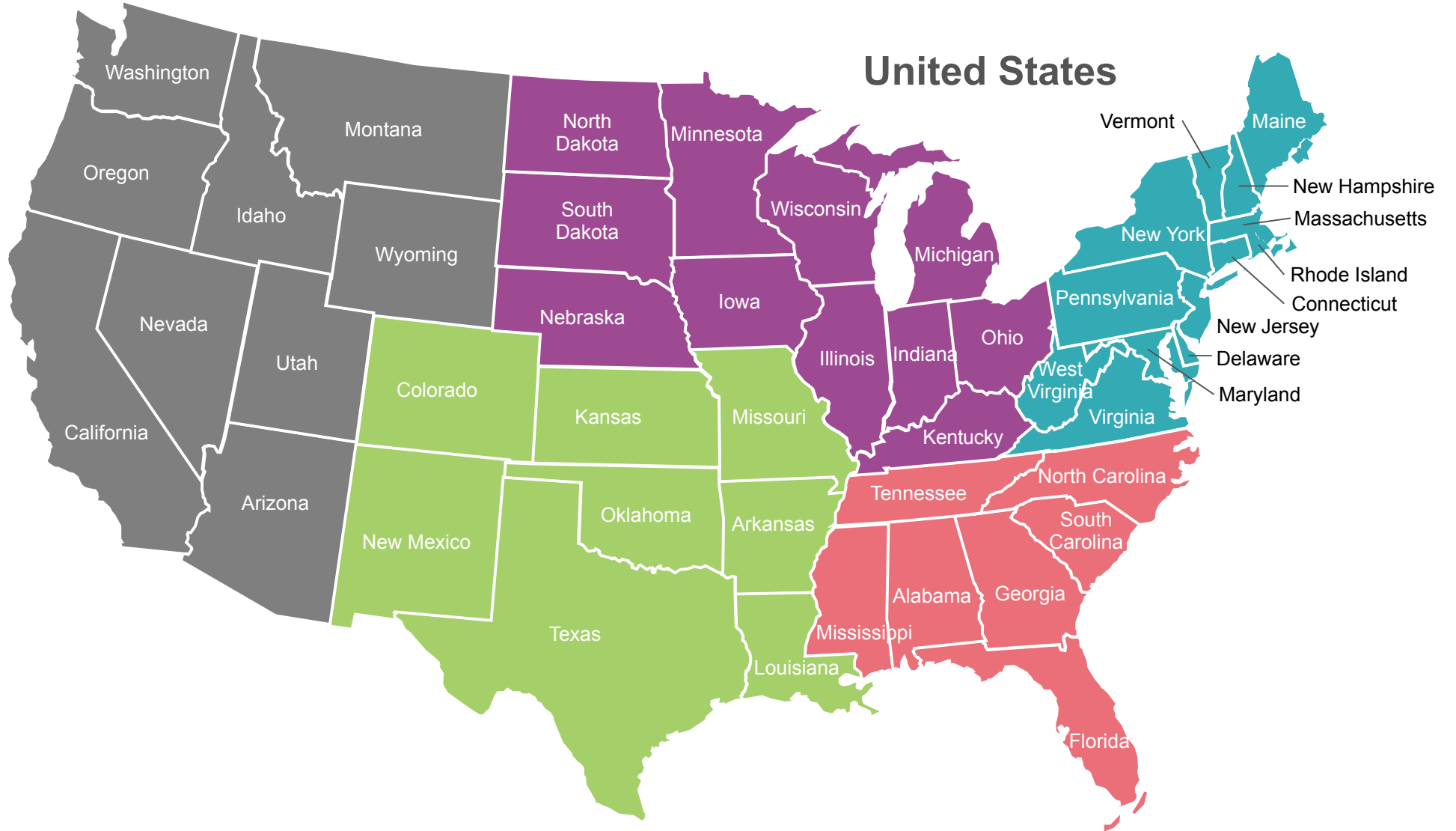
UCWDC Regions - World Map

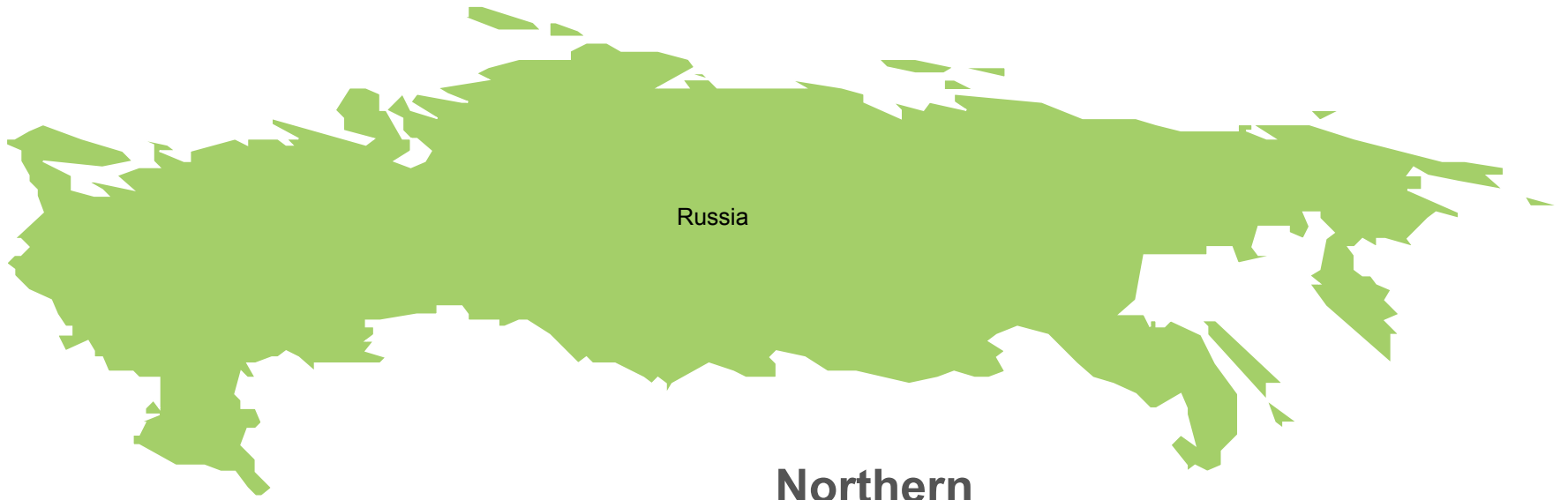
